As a resident of the Historic Northeast community, I strongly stand with the Pendleton Heights Neighborhood, the Scarritt Renaissance Neighborhood Associations in strong opposition to the re-issuance of CLNU # 3156 that would allow the continuance of what we consider to be a predatory lending business at 2600 Independence Boulevard. Clearly the building is more than 50% destroyed and should be demolished in accordance with city statutes.

As noted in a column entitled "Blood Money" in this week's Northeast News (12/9/2015) the building is the last vestage of a fire started for the sole purpose of collecting insurance money. That fire killed two neighborhood heroes, Firefighter John V. Mesh and Firefighter Larry Leggio. Rebuilding the structure and reopening the predatory loan business headquartered there will only serve as a gut wrenching reminder of that tragic fire to these two area families as well as the Historic Northeast community.
